

#### From Hazel Davis, Half-time Team Vicar for Outreach and Mission

I am so looking forward to meeting and getting to know you all. I pray that as we worship, listen to God, and grow in faith that He will show us how we can together bless our community and demonstrate God's love in word and action.

I became a Christian when I was 21, after receiving a letter from home whilst serving in the first Gulf War. When I returned from the Gulf, I read the Bible from beginning to end within three months and had a spiritual encounter with God which changed my perspective and purpose for life. After leaving the armed forces I married Laurence my childhood sweetheart. We lived in Nienberg, Germany with our two children Faye and Jacob until we were posted back to the UK in 1995. I joined Cambridge Community Church (C3), grew in my faith and realised my passion for youthwork. We fostered for a time, then had our third child, Lorena.

My husband left the forces and we moved to the Cotswolds, joining

a Baptist church where we ran home groups, started and led several youth groups, town and youth festivals, and worked with local councils and committees. We were also founding and running multiple businesses including a busy risk management consultancy with employees and associates across the country. We closed one of our companies in 2010, freeing me to begin studying for my BA(Hons) in Youth & Community Work and Practical Theology at Bristol Baptist College.

In 2016 we moved to Swindon and I started my MA in Christian Spirituality at Sarum College in order to gain a wider perspective and knowledge of Christianity and my place as a woman in leadership within the church.

It was through my MA that I began to feel a growing sense of calling to ordination. Over the next few years, I explored the call to ordination in the CofE, which meant joining the local Anglican church, St Mary's Church, Lydiard Tregoze in Swindon. It was a wonderful, affirming experience and from there I went on to ordination training at Ridley Hall, Cambridge. I served my curacy in St Chad's Burton and St Mary's Stretton in Staffordshire. I also continued my studies from MPhil to a PhD part time on *Uncovering a Female Theology of Leadership of Hildegard of Bingen (1098-1179) and Joan of Arc (1412-1431) through Critical Leadership Studies*. My curacy was a deeply profound period of personal and spiritual growth where I grew in confidence and continued to build on my experience and passion for outreach and mission.

As the new half-time Team Vicar for Community Outreach and Mission, my heart is to look for positive ways to bring people together, to encourage existing links and create new ones between schools, churches, and local community groups. My approach will include relationship-building, supporting and empowering others to grow in confidence to develop their gifts, and fostering a welcoming and inclusive environment for all. I hope to bring a blend of creativity, administrative skills, and a deep passion for community engagement. My goal is to lead by example, encouraging and supporting our teams to share God's love both practically and spiritually. I am thrilled to join the Vale of Pewsey team and look forward to making Jesus known and helping to make our churches a beacon of hope and service within their communities.

#### From Matthew Haynes, Assistant Curate

Hello everyone! I am very excited about joining the Vale of Pewsey benefice as curate at the end of June. I am particularly looking forward to meeting as many of you as possible and getting to know the benefice as quickly as I can. My family and I will continue to live in Ramsbury, where we have been for over twenty years now.

Having studied part-time at Sarum College in Salisbury for three years, I was ordained as a deacon on 30 June in Salisbury Cathedral. All ordained ministers, including bishops, are deacons first and always. The name comes from the Greek word 'diakonia', meaning ministry, service and support. So it is a ministry focused on service to others, to the community and to God. I look forward to living this out in the benefice. I will continue with my job in education during the week, although I am reducing my hours from September. I am also a hospital chaplain.



My hope is that I will be able to support and help others in whatever way that they need. The philosopher Blaise Pascal once said that there is a 'God-shaped hole in every human heart'. I think this means that, whatever our specific beliefs, it is part of being human to seek love, hope and acceptance. We might have a sense of wanting to belong. We search for a sense of peace, perhaps. Helping people to find even just a little of these things is really important to me, because the world has a whole range of ways we can fill our hearts with things that are not so good. Working as a hospital chaplain is teaching me a lot. Most of the people that I meet are facing big challenges. Uncertainty often fills their lives. Some are coming towards the end of life. I also meet a lot of staff too, as you might imagine, all of whom work so hard and with such incredible dedication, care and expertise. I am finding that often the most powerful

#### 15<sup>th</sup> July St Swithun (or Swithin) - saint for a rainy day

St Swithun is apparently the saint you can blame for rainy summers. It is said that if it rains on his special day, 15<sup>th</sup> July, it will then rain for 40 days after that. It all began when Swithun was made Bishop of Winchester in 852 by King Ethelwulf of Wessex. It was an important posting: Winchester was the capital of Wessex, and during the 10 years Swithun was there, Wessex became the most important kingdom of England.

During his life, instead of washing out people's summer holidays, and damping down their spirits, Swithun seems to have done a lot of good. He was famous for his charitable gifts and for his energy in getting churches built. When he was dying in 862, he asked that he be buried in the cemetery of the Old Minster, just outside the west door.

If he had been left there in peace, who knows how many rainy summers the English may have been spared over the last 1000 years. But, no, it was decided to move Swithun. By now, the 960s, Winchester had become the first monastic cathedral chapter in England, and the newly installed monks wanted Swithun in the cathedral with them. So finally, on 15 July 971, his bones were dug up and Swithun was translated into the cathedral.

That same day many people claimed to have had miraculous cures. Certainly everyone got wet, for the heavens opened. The unusually heavy rain that day, and on the days following, was attributed to the power of St Swithun. Swithun was moved again in 1093, into the new Winchester cathedral. His shrine was a popular place of pilgrimage throughout the middle ages. The shrine was destroyed during the Reformation and restored in 1962. There are 58 ancient dedications to Swithun in England.

## **Fellowship Of Contemplative Prayer**

Our local contemplative prayer group meets monthly in Manor Court at 2.00pm for our one hour exercise of guided silent prayer based on first person Biblical quotes of either God, through His prophets, or Jesus, in the Gospels. Example- "I AM WITH YOU ALWAYS" MATT 28:20

The three-fold method practised by the fellowship (FCP)involves-

MIND- Why was the word spoken, context.

HEART- What does it mean to us, revelation.

WILL- Using our WILLS sending the Word to the objects of our concerns, or Intersessions.

Each exercise (as we refer to our session) opens with a settling down 2 minutes repeating the phrase "Come to me, all you who are weary and heavy laden, and I will give you rest" Matthew 11.28

Followed by an introduction to the first silence i.e. of the Mind- followed by 10 minutes or so of silence repeating our Word in our minds in context of the introduction, in time with our breathing.

We then move on to an introduction to the second silence i.e. of the Heart- followed by 10 minutes or so of silence repeating our Word in our minds in context of the introduction, in time with our breathing.

Finally using our Wills to send our Word to the objects of our concerns e.g. "To those suffering homelessness our Lord says- "I am with you always" Matthew 28:20

We close sharing the Grace followed by tea and cake/biscuits

#### D Day Remembered at Rushall Village Hall

The Rushall and Charlton Village Hall Committee was recently delighted to extend a warm welcome to a new member, John Winskill. A retired Infantry Major, John is an accomplished military historian with a particular interest in the events of 6<sup>th</sup> June 1944. Who better to provide a presentation to the local residents to mark this notorious occasion.

On Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> June the hall was prepared with a screen and appropriately shaped green carpet to show the layout of the famous Normandy coast and beaches with relevant villages, bridges and areas highlighted. Having only returned from Normandy a few hours before, John, fully dressed and made up for the part, provided a comprehensive commentary with actual photos and film of the day while his children helped by pointing out the relevant places and showing some of the actual weapons and equipment carried.


John and his family kindly provided their excellent presentation twice. The first during the afternoon, mainly intended for the younger audience and again during the evening for the adults. Both events were well attended and the audience participation went down well with them making and launching paper aeroplanes to represent the glider-borne landings and mini-parachutes to represent the airborne assault.

The presentation first highlighted the events and decisions leading up to Hitler's conquest of most of mainland Europe, then the isolation of the British Isles and Winston Churchill's leadership in preparing the country and the rest of the free world for the battles to come. Finally, John demonstrated his vast subject knowledge by taking the audience through the sequence of events during the biggest ever invasion ever likely in the history of the world.

A thoroughly enjoyable and enlightening presentation enjoyed by all who attended.






