


CLERGY LETTER

I love the natural world, God's creation, love exploring it and finding out more about it. Knowing the name of a plant or animal is a gateway to understanding them and protecting them. I have two free apps which I have downloaded onto my phone. I regularly use them when I am in the garden or allotment, out and about locally and on holidays. It's a great way of introducing friends, children and grandchildren to the wonderful variety of species all around us. If you hear a bird singing and don't know what it is, the app "Merlin Bird ID by Cornell Lab" is amazing. If you don't know the name of a plant or a creature then you can take a photograph and it can be identified using the app "Seek by iNaturalist".

We live in a most beautiful part of the UK, with a great diversity of wildlife all around us. I often fail to recognise a flower or a bird. Since using the apps, I have come to appreciate even more the great variety of wildlife all around us. As Sir David Attenborough has pointed out, when people enjoy and understand more about the natural environment, then they are much more likely to want to look after it. There are many ways that we can take action; stopping the use of pesticides in our homes and gardens, putting out food and water for birds and other visitors to our gardens such as hedgehogs, and putting up nest boxes. Now is a good time to be doing this so the boxes are part of the natural landscape. Besides the traditional nest boxes, think about making and putting up a swift box as these birds are in desperate need of suitable housing.

A further way of nurturing God's creation – of increasing the biodiversity of our surroundings is to plant more trees. People locally, church and non-church goers are planning to plant more trees over the coming months. Muddy Church and also some of the local youth are getting involved. Trees are great as they provide food and shelter for so many creatures and other plants as well as providing us with shade and with occasional fruits and nuts etc.

Understanding and appreciating the green vastness, the complexities, the variety and the interdependence of life in and around trees gives us a sense of wonder, amazement and thankfulness to God.

Christians believe that the Earth is the Lord's and everything in it and that we have a duty to care for the World and to live in harmony with the natural environment.

Harvest Festival services are a traditional way of celebrating and giving thanks to God for crops and the food we eat. It is part of a longer season known by the church as Creationtide, when our thoughts and prayers focus on both the harvest safely gathered in, and God's blessings through the created world, – the natural environment.

As we go out to enjoy and care for the precious local, natural environment, let us offer this prayer.

Gracious God, plant within us a reverence for your natural world and all that you give us. Help us to nurture and protect your Creation. Amen

For those readers who don't know us we run a community run bus which seats 14 passengers. We offer regular shopping runs to Devizes, Salisbury and Marlborough. The schedule and fares are shown below. Our services are all door-to-door, picking up and dropping off at your home. **The driver will carry your shopping in for you should you need help.**

The villages we currently service are Connock, Chirton, Patney, Marden, Wilsford, Beechingstoke, Woodborough, Bottlesford, Honeystreet, Alton Barnes, Hilcott and Manningford Bruce. Since our services are dial a ride, if you would like to book a seat please contact Alan Coggins on 01380 840302. Bookings are taken up to 7pm. on the evening before departure. We accept bus passes on all our shopping runs and we have spare seats.

<u>Schedule and fares for our regular services all free to bus</u> pass holders:

Devizes supermarket run: every Friday. First pickup 9.30am, returning from Devizes at 12.00pm.

Fare £2.00. We pick you up from your door drop you off at the supermarket of your choice. We will pick you from the same supermarket and drop you back at your door.


Salisbury: 8th & 22nd October, 12th & 26th November. First pickup 9.30am, returning from Salisbury at 1.30pm. **Fare £4.00.** Again, we pick you up from your door and drop you off close to Marks & Spencer and vice versa for the return journey. This is market day in Salisbury.

Marlborough: 16th October & 20th November. First pickup 9.30am, returning from Marlborough at 12.00pm **Fare £3.00** Again we pick you up from your door and drop you off by the car park entrance to Waitrose and vice versa for

the return. Both the Salisbury and Marlborough are unique service as they are the only direct bus services to these destinations from our villages.

The above scheduled services are open to all age groups and not just bus pass holders. The fares represent very good value for money so why not join our friendly passengers and drivers. Cash for Coronets: An Architectural legacy Between 1870 and 1914, at the height of America's Gilded Age, no fewer than 454 American heiresses exchanged their crisp American dollars for musty, old, European titles. Apart from the new lease of life those dollars afforded the previously cash-strapped aristocrats, their money was primarily used to restore their crumbling ancestral piles, many of which today, we count amongst our best loved national treasures. We look at some of these dollar "fairy godmothers", the frequently eye-opening stories of how couples were matched and how the money was spent on the houses which now stand as their often-overlooked architectural legacy. The speaker is Mark Meredith. He is the founder of

HouseHistree.com and lectures regularly in the US and Europe. He has a passion for history and loves telling a story, rather than 'delivering a lecture'. Nurture Nature

A lovely day today in mid September as I write this month's article. Soon landscapes will be festooned in



beautiful spiders' webs. Garden birds are emerging from their moults and one can often spot the discarded feathers. Unhappily, due to further decline in our British bird numbers continue in a downward spiral year on year. One hardly saw a starling or a house sparrow this year on feeders, or foraging on lawns and veg patches. It will be interesting to see what numbers constitute this autumn's murmurations – so fascinating to hear and see overhead in places

such as Chirton Gorse and Marden Cowbag near Salisbury Plain, and also around Slimbridge and Cam. Readers have reported that some of the songsters contributing to dawn choruses are absent this year, even the ubiquitous and well loved national bird, the robin, are in decline. But this autumn it is noticeable that robin numbers are down, meaning that they no longer have to sing from dawn to dusk in order to announce 'this garden is mine'. It is estimated that there are seven million robin territories in this country. Incidentally, Vera Lynn's song about a nightingale singing in Berkeley Square, was more likely to have been a robin, as they will sing in towns where street lighting means they have to be alert at all hours. Last month I wrote that I would say something about rooks. Rooks are gregarious and noisy birds, and tend to join jackdaws to form very large flocks which are guite a spectacle when they do one of their mass 'fly overs'. Not confined to the countryside, they can be found anywhere there are tall mature trees in which to build their messy nests, which they have to repair each spring, often attempting to bring sticks which are so large and unwieldy that they end up dropping them. They will eat pretty much anything, including small birds and mammals, and will mob birds of prey too. Like all corvids they are crafty and their 'rookeries' can be very large and distinctive, and are often in use for years, sometimes decades. PEWSEY PARISH COUNCIL

In late 2023 the Parish Council resurrected the Community Emergency Planning Team (CERT), fortuitously just in time to respond to the flooding in January this year. Flooding remains the highest risk identified, and a Flood Working Group was formed, which is sponsored by the Parish Council, and comprises councillors and local residents who have been flooded, or are at risk of flooding. A new flood response plan is close to completion, and pamphlets will be distributed on preparedness for, and actions on, flooding events or warnings to at risk properties. A second pamphlet will be distributed to properties that own portions of the river bank and have riparian legal responsibilities. The CERT now has a number of volunteers who are willing to support the community in the event of an emergency, and if you would like to assist please email the parish clerk (<u>the.clerk@pewsey-pc.gov.uk</u>).

Pewsey has a new batch of Community Speed Watch volunteers to monitor the speed of vehicles in the village. Those found speeding are reported to the police so the driver can be educated about its dangers. If you would like to volunteer, please contact ClIr Lizzie Humfress via email – <u>lizzie.humfress@pewsey-pc.gov.uk</u>. Wiltshire Unitary Authority is responsible for the roads and most of the pavements around Pewsey, and any defect or other relevant highways issue can be reported to them by telephone, email, post, and online – see https://www.wiltshire.gov.uk/highways-contact-us.






